The Celebration Goes On – With Easter Day comes life, light and joy. Jesus' death was not the end. He came to earth to give His life, in order to make peace between God and us and to bring the whole universe back to God. His rising to life proved that he had won the battle against sin, darkness and death, once and for all. All these events happened nearly 2000 years ago, and it often seems that evil and suffering and violence still rule the world. But Jesus made two promises, which make the final victory of good and justice certain. Before He left the world to go back to His Father, Jesus promised to send His Holy Spirit to live with His followers, bringing them courage and strength to defeat sin and fear in their own lives. Peter and the disciples were changed people when the Holy Spirit came down on them on the first day of Pentecost.
