Building a Relationship with God

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Prayer

God has made us a relationship with him and longs to share his life with each one of us. Prayer is the communication with him that sustains and deepens that relationship. Just as we communicate with our family and friends to keep our relationships strong, we must also communicate with God to build and strength our relationship. Prayer is two-way communication that includes speaking, listening and simply being silent in God's presence.

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Attending Mass

"Why do I have to go to church?" is a familiar question that people can sometimes ask. Sometimes people may think of Mass as too long or boring. It's easy to think this way if we expect Mass to be a form of entertainment. However, Mass is more than about what we see and hear. In the Mass, God leads us to our salvation as we celebrate in the Paschal Mystery - the Passion, death, Resurrection and Ascension of Christ, and receive the Eucharist.

Role Models in Faith

Role models are extremely important in our lives. They help us learn new things, they help us to grow as individuals and they help us to set a path for our lives.

Facing Challenges

As young people, you face many challenges every day. When we face challenging situations in our lives, we may find it hard to accept that God truly knows what is best for us. Describe a challenging situation a young person your age might face and how trust in God can make it easier to accept.



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Building Virtues

Virtue is a disposition to do good. Each day, we take tiny steps towards virtue by building good habits. When we make virtuous choices, even when it is challenging, good habits become more and more ingrained in us.
